



FIRST ON EMERGENCY SCENE

OBJECTIVE

To provide definition of and outline the implications and difficulties that may be encountered as a person who is first on the scene of an emergency situation.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- Be aware of agencies roles and responsibilities
- Have a knowledge of legal implications in emergency situations
- To appreciate information gathering and assessment in the pre-planning process
- Understand the decision process likely to be required in response during the initial operation phase
- Be aware of probable handover requirements to responding agencies
- Have an understanding of after event process and reporting
